Swimming Pool

Weather permitting, the pool will be open daily from late May from 9am – 6pm.

9am -10am will be an adults swim only.

Your Safety is paramount to us here at Seaview and the Pool Rules are simply explained. Children UNDER 8 MUST be ONE TO ONE supervision IN THE WATER. Children 8-16 MUST be supervised ONE TO TWO in the water or poolside. Please ensure you SIGN IN & OUT at reception, other swimming pool rules are there to maintain the safety levels for everyone's enjoyment, please ensure these are observed always to avoid embarrassment.

Swimming Pool Seating Areas

All the tiers above the pool level are viewing and seating areas to enjoy the views and surroundings, this cannot be used as a supervising area and please do not enter the roped areas unless you are swimming or supervising. Please also note that only food and drink purchased from the shop can be taken into the pool area and only 'non-breakable' items can be used. Dogs are allowed in these areas but they must be kept on a short lead.

Walks in South Cornwall

KING'S WOOD AND PENTEWAN

A circular walk through the King's Wood Woodland Trust reserve to the lost port of Pentewan.

3.3 miles. Easy-moderate

PORTCOTHAN TO MAWGAN PORTH

A one-way walk along the coast with spectacular wild flowers and the Bedruthan Steps.

4.5 miles. Easy-moderate

MEVAGISSEY TO PORTMELLON

A circular walk from the busy fishing port of Mevagissey into the Portmellon Valley.

3.9 miles. Moderate

GRAMPOUND TO TRENOWTH

A circular walk in the Fal valley from Grampound.

4.8 miles. Moderate

GORRAN HAVEN TO DODMAN POINT

A circular walk on the Roseland.

5 miles. Moderate

GORRAN HAVEN TO PORTMELLON

A circular walk taking in Gorran church

5.9 miles. Moderate

PENTEWAN AND MEVAGISSEY

A circular walk via The Lost Gardens of Heligan.

6.4 miles. Moderate - Strenuous

PENTEWAN VALLEY AND BLACK HEAD

A circular walk from the lost port of Pentewan.

6.7 miles. Moderate - Strenuous

MEVAGISSEY TO CHARLESTOWN

A one-way coastal walk via one of the world's best-preserved Georgian ports.

Cycle Routes in Cornwall

Clay Trails

Surrounding the Cornish town of St Austell is a landscape well known for its clay tips and pits. This striking and dramatic scenery has been made more accessible by the development of trails for walking, cycling and horse riding.

Pentewan Trail

Enjoy *wild flowers, wooded countryside* and fine views on this route which takes you along a flat, former railway line to the beach and harbour at Pentewan. For Heligan, turn right after 3 miles over a wooden bridge and follow an old carriage drive uphill to the lovingly restored Lost Gardens of Heligan. From Heligan, you can follow

the Route 3 signs along the traffic-free trail steeply down into the village of Mevagissey.

St Austell to Par

This short ride takes you along National Cycle route 3 from St Austell to Par. Much of this pleasant route is traffic free with the finish point at the attractive Par Sands making it a nice leisurely afternoon ride.

St Austell to Bodmin

Follow National Cycle Network route 3 on this short route which passes through some lovely countryside. The main highlight on the route though is the splendid Eden Project which is near the beginning of the route.

ROYAL CORNWALL SHOW

Beaches to explore...

SENNEN BEACH *(Pic below)*

A short walk over the cliffs from Land's End, Sennen is a charming fishing cove with a long, sandy beach that offers excellent swimming and consistent surf. At low tide the beach joins up with its neighbour to provide over a mile of golden sand, so that even on hot summer days it is usually possible to find plenty of space to spread out. There are cafes, surf shops and the Old Success pub within easy walking distance of the car park. Surf lessons and board hire are available and the beach is patrolled by lifeguards during the summer months.



GODREVY BEACH *(Pic above)*

The northernmost and most dramatic section of the three-mile long sandy beach that stretches from Hayle to Godrevy Head. Godrevy takes the brunt of the *Atlantic swell* and is one of the more exposed beaches on the north coast, holding big swells and yielding a rugged splendour on a stormy winter's day. The beach terminates with a low rocky headland that offers great views of Godrevy lighthouse, which was the real-life inspiration for Virginia Woolfe's novel *To The Lighthouse*. There is an excellent cafe in the National Trust car park located just behind the dunes.


PRAA SANDS

Praa Sands is a medium-sized sandy beach located on the more sheltered south coast between Perranuthnoe and Porthleven. Popular with surfers, especially beginners, Praa Sands works best with a southerly swell and

a northerly wind. In summer the sea is usually flat, making Praa Sands an excellent choice for swimmers and children. There are plenty of facilities, including shops, cafes and toilets, and several camp sites within easy walking distance of the beach.

MARAZION BEACH *(Pic below)*

Marazion lies at the far end of a long expanse of pebbly sand that stretches all the way back to Penzance. The Marazion end the beach is backed by dunes and faces the iconic St Michael's Mount, accessible via a causeway that is exposed at low tide. The south-facing beach switches from being calm and sheltered and perfect for families to receiving the brunt of strong southerly gales, making it a popular spot with windsurfers. The sand gives way to rocky coves at the town end of the beach, and many facilities can be found in what is considered to be one of the oldest towns in England.



KYNANCE COVE

It is easy to see why Kynance Cove, located two miles from Lizard Point, is one of the most photographed beaches in Cornwall. white sand, brilliant *turquoise water*, islands, caves and stunning serpentine rock formations all serve to make this one of the prettiest places around. Popular since Victorian times, Kynance Cove has recently been made more accessible, thanks to a National Trust toll road and car park. It is still at least half an hour from anywhere however, which makes checking the very inconsistent but occasionally good surf something of a mission.

SALTASH REGATTA

Saturday 17th June

Saltash Regatta is one of the most colourful events in the Cornish calendar. There is rowing on the Saturday followed by a Flash Boat Regatta on the Sunday and sailing, canoeing, swimming and even a cardboard boat race are also on offer. This regatta isn't just about water sports, there is plenty to do on dry land to keep everyone happy and entertained, so don't miss it.

MEVAGISSEY FEAST WEEK

Sunday 25th June – Saturday 1st July

Mevagissey has celebrated the 'Feast of St Peter' since 1754 and it has evolved into a wonderful community event. The Feast Week Committee run a full week of activities for locals and visitors to enjoy.

BOARDMASTERS MUSIC & SURF FESTIVAL

9th – 13th August

Boardmasters Festival returns to Watergate Bay and Fistral Beach from Wednesday 9 August to Sunday 13 August 2017.
